## Temple of Aaron To Present Silversmith

A distinguished silversmith, Professor Arie Ofir, will display his work at the Temple of Aaron, St. Paul, Friday, March 30, through Sunday, April 1. He will appear at the opening of the exhibit 8 p.m. March 30 and will explain his philosophy and techniques 4 p.m., March 31.

Born in Israel in 1938, Prof. Ofir studied in Copenhagen and is now head of the Gold and Silversmithing Department of Bezalel Academy of Arts and Design in Jerusalem. His works have been exhibited in Israel, Belgium, West Germany, England and the United States.

Prof. Ofir designs and produces Jewish ritual objects in contemporary motifs. Objects are hand-made in sterling silver and include one-of-a-kind Torah crowns, spice boxes, and Menoras.
